Southport United Methodist Church Yard Sale

SUMC yard sale will take place on Saturday, August 14, from 8 AM to 1 PM, in the back parking lot on Van Dyke Street. Families, small groups and ministry groups are welcome to participate. Proceeds from the sale can be given to the "What If" campaign and help eliminate the mortgage debt.

Each family, small group, or ministry group will be responsible for their booth and selling their items, as well as tear down and removal of all items not sold. The fundraising team will be responsible for all advertising.

Set-up and Booth Information:

- Set-up is 6-8 AM day of yard sale
- Bring your own tent, table, chairs, etc. tents will need weights/tie downs
- All items need to be priced
- Tear down and removal of all unsold items is the responsibility of the group/family
- A limited number of church tables will be available and must be reserved • Saw horses and plywood can be used in place of tables

Cash/Donations

- Each booth will be responsible for its money
 - Cash (preferred) or PayPal, Venmo, Zelle, ApplePay, etc.
 - Post a payment method sign within booth
 - O A minimum of \$50 petty cash is suggested to start the day
- SUMC is a nonprofit organization and can only accept donations
- Donations can be made to church after the sale is over
- Donations will go to the "What If" campaign with the first 10% to Faith Promise, our ministry outreach fund
- If multiple people are selling from one booth, they are responsible to let
- Brandon Collins, our church financial officer, to clearly know which individual has made the donation
 - O Envelopes/ Banker bags can be made available

- Add price tags to all items
- DO NOT bring items to church until the day of the sale
- Baked goods/craft items are also good to sell
