Membership Has It's Privileges

Dear Friends,

A few years ago at another church I preached a sermon with the title, "Membership Has It's Privileges." It was a take on the old American Express advertising campaign of the same name, which may have still been running at the time.

I forget what all the points were that I may have made in my sermon, (I'm sure they were all deep and important!), but the bottom line was that the basic privilege of membership in a church is the privilege of saying "We", of belonging and being part of a family and community.

As March begins, we are really moving into Lent in a big way. Palm Sunday and Easter won't arrive until April, so we have the whole month of March as the hours of sunlight lengthen each day (Lent, from the Old English, literally means the "lengthening of days"), and Spring is upon us, to devote ourselves to the spiritual side of our lives.

Each Tuesday night in March (we actually begin on the last Tuesday of the previous month, February 28), we will be combining this Lenten devotion to our spiritual lives with a good, long, hard look at what it means to be a Christian and more particularly, what it means to be a member of the body of Christ, the church.

I hope you will join us for these. I think they will be enriching and exhilarating times together. We'll try to call upon the diverse and various resources of our church family, including but not limited to some of the great chefs who call Southport UMC home.

So remember, each Tuesday night, February 28 and March 7, 14, 21 and 28, at 6:00 for "Taco Tuesday", and 7:00 for our interactive study, "Body Parts: Anatomy of a Church."

February 23, 26	"Do I Really Believe God Has a Plan for My Life?"	Jeremiah 29:11; Matthew 4:1-11	Does God have a plan for my life? Do I really believe that? As I look back over my life, do I see God's hand at work? As I look toward the future, do I sense that God has given me a vision for what I might do and where I might go? Has God given me goals and prospects? When I look to the future, do I have hope? Does the example of Jesus, withstanding the wiles of the devil at the beginning of his earthly ministry, give strength and meaning and a plan of action?

March 9, 12	"Do I Really Believe in Miracles?"	Isaiah 40:21-31; John 1:29-42	Miracles were such a big part of the Bible times we read about, and such a big part of the ministry of Jesus. There were healings of various kinds, exorcisms, people receiving their sight, and even people being raised from the dead. Do miracles still happen today? In what ways are people healed and given their sight and even given a brand new life?		
March 16, 19	"Do I Really Believe in Heaven?"	Luke 16:19-31	Heaven is mentioned quite a bit in the Bible, and we have some images of what it might be like. How do we know for sure that there is a heaven, and why is it important for me to believe in heaven right now? Of all the images of heaven, what is most important for me to hold onto?


There is still time to join our Lenten Study!
