April 27, 30	"Amazingly Graced"	Ephesians 2:1-10	John Wesley, the founder of the Methodist movement, believed that God's grace was the greatest power to impact the world and transform lives. Grace is a love that we have done nothing to earn or deserve, but it is showered on us anyway, saving us from sin and giving us direction and purpose.
May 4, 7	"How Do I Spend My Time?"	Luke 12:13-21	In the small groups that John Wesley started, participants would ask each other questions and respond, starting spiritual conversations. Some of the questions were things like: "Is Jesus real to me?" "Am I enjoying prayer?" and "Did the Bible live in me today?" One question asked was, "How do I spend my time?" So, how do you spend your time? How do you try to maximize your time to have the most fulfilling life and be a faithful servant of Jesus Christ?
May 11, 14	"Where Am I Living Victoriously?"	Psalm 66:8-20	One of the questions that John Wesley would ask in his Methodist small groups was, "Am I defeated in any part of my life?" To identify those defeated places and turn them around, with God's help, is how to overcome and live victoriously. It is also important to identify those places in your life where God is already helping you to live victoriously, and celebrate and strengthen that part of your life. Our mothers are often indispensably instrumental in helping us be resilient and victorious in life.
May 18, 21	"A Heart Strangely Warmed"	Acts 1:6-14	John Wesley spent his early years searching for an intimacy and closeness to God, like the disciples waiting on the Holy Spirit to come once Jesus had ascended into heaven. One day Wesley did come to the point where he felt his "Heart strangely warmed," that he did trust in God, God alone. What does Wesley's search for God and finally being found by God mean today for you and me?

Thanks for your donations to the pantry in April. From now on, until our school donations in the fall, **Southport UMC will be focused on donating canned beans.** The pantry goes through about 132 cans of beans in a week. So the need is really great!

FEED A NEED (FAN)


