LENT

Dear Friends.

I don't know if it's obvious or not, but I am not a big fan of winter. It may just be getting older, but I don't tolerate the cold and snow as well as I used to. (Brenda and I were fortunate to get away for a couple of weeks in January to visit with Brenda's mother who lives in Florida. It wasn't overly hot where we were, but it wasn't zero and colder, like it was here at times!)

And one thing I really dislike are the shorter hours of daylight during the winter. It just seems cruel to not have the sun rise until after 8:00 some mornings and set before 5:30. I am one who looks at the Weather Channel app on my phone pretty regularly to watch the daylight hours increase by a minute or two each day.

And when I see the daylight hours getting longer, I think of this new church season that we will soon be entering – Lent. In fact, the word "Lent" comes from an Old English word that means lengthen, and it signifies the lengthening of the days at this time of year. As we march steadily on through winter and head encouragingly on to spring, we also proceed through the season of Lent and set our sights on Easter!

Lent is that 40-day season of prayer and reflection and denial as we remember the 40 days Jesus spent fasting in the desert and enduring temptation. It is a time when many decide to be more intentional about following Christ's will more faithfully. Sometimes people study the Bible more, especially the life of Jesus in the Gospels, and give up something they really like.

We have some things planned here at the church to help make Lent more meaningful: our Pancake Dinner the evening before Lent begins; our Ash Wednesday worship service; a Lenten Bible Study on Wednesday nights; and all the events of Holy Week and Easter Weekend. We hope you will participate in anything and everything.

I heard someone say once and I believe it to be true: the more you put into Lent, the more you will get out of Easter.







ebruary 15 and 18	"Being Aware of Something More"	John 10:1-10	Max Lucado wrote, "There is more to this life than this life." Are you aware of the something more that he was talking about? Are you living the abundant life Jesus came to offer us? What are the things stealing your abundant life and the something more?
ebruary 22 and 25	"Our Greatest Need"	Luke 15:11-32	Have you ever thought about what your greatest need is in life? What is your greatest need to survive? What does this familiar Parable of the Prodigal Son (some Bible scholars have regarded it as the "Prodigal Father") have to say about our greatest need?
ebruary 29 and March 3	"Your Most Important Daily Decision"	Matthew 6:1-15	What would you say is your most important daily decision? Whether we realize it or not, we make hundreds of decisions each day, but what is the one that is most pivotal to helping us create the life we want and that has the most value? How do we bring God more into our life each day?
March 7 and 10	"Putting First Things First"	Matthew 6:25-34	We often hear "Keep the main thing the main thing," and "Put first things first." But how do we always know what to put first as the most important thing, and how can we put what's most important first on a daily basis when we have so many demands on our life? Help, God! I need you to show me the way!
Narch 14 and 17	"What If There Were a Place?"	John 4:1-30, 39-42	Use the Samaritan woman at the well, we are all looking for that place in life, no matter what we have done, no matter what our past, where we can have a sense of belonging a place where we can feel cafe and saved. Where is that place for you? Your home? Your relationships? Your church? Your community? Your spiritual sense of belonging with God?
March 21 and 24 Palm Sunday)	"The Darkness and the Dawn"	Matthew 21:1-11	The week we are entering is full of exhilarating highs and perilous lows, "the darkness and the dawn," as one Bible scholar has referred to it. People well come Jesus to Jerusalem and want to crown him as king, but then it is the same people maybe who are ready to crucify him a few days later. How can we, as Christians today, navigate through this week and experience and be nurtured by the highs and lows.

No matter your heritage, culture, or racial background, Black history is EVERYONE's story. Here are 10 ways you, your family, and your congregation can celebrate and participate in Black History Month.

- 1. Patronize a local or online Black-owned business.
- 2. Attend church, Bible study, or worship at a historically Black church and experience the Gospel from another vantage point.
- 3. Sing hymns or songs during worship by a composer from the African diaspora. Include the history of the song or hymn in the church bulletin or on your website.
- 4. Attend or co-host a Black history or Black culture event in your community, in partnership with a Black congregation.
- 5. Take a church family field trip to a Black history site or museum in your area.
- 6. Learn more about "Black Harry" Hosier (c. 1750-1806), an African-American Methodist preacher and evangelist.
- 7. Research other Black United Methodist leaders from our church's heritage.
- 8. Fearlessly learn more about how racism has and still affects Black people around the world and start confronting racism.
- 9. Donate to a Black nonprofit or empowerment organization in your community.
- 10. Watch a film by and about the heritage and lives of Black people. Titles to consider: "Antwone Fisher," "Malcolm X," "If Beale Street Could Talk," "Hidden Figures," "The Hate U Give," and "One Night in Miami."
