Dear Southport UMC,

As we enter November, I find myself filled with gratitude for the journey we have shared these past four months. Your warmth and commitment to this church have been a blessing beyond words. Together, we celebrated our 175th anniversary, and what a celebration it was! From the special music to the lively fellowship, we were reminded of God's enduring faithfulness. Thank you to everyone who made it possible, and thank you for dreaming with us about what the next 175 years of ministry could look like.

November is a time of giving thanks. We remember how God has blessed us and those who came before us, as well as the dreams they dared to dream for our church. On All Saints Sunday, November 3rd, we will honor those saints who have passed on, whose lives continue to inspire us as we light candles and call their names. Their witness reminds us that we are surrounded by a "great cloud of witnesses," as Hebrews 12 tells us, cheering us on to dream bigger dreams for the future.

But what does it mean to dream? Dreams have always been significant in scripture, often representing God's way of revealing God's plans for the future. Jacob's dream of a stairway to heaven wasn't just a dream of comfort or escape. It was God's way of showing him the path to a new future, one that would shape the lives of generations to come. Dreams, particularly "God-sized" dreams, are often bigger than what we could imagine on our own. They call us to be courageous, to step out in faith, and to trust that God is leading us toward something greater.

This November, I want to invite each of us to ask ourselves: Are we dreaming big enough? Are we willing to let go of the small, "just get by" plans and embrace the vastness of God's vision for our lives and our church? Our new sermon series, *Dare to Dream*, is all about this: daring to live into the dreams that God has for us.

Sometimes, like Jacob or Moses at the burning bush, we might be hesitant. God's dreams for us often require more courage than we think we have. But in these moments, we remember that God doesn't call the equipped—He equips the called.

On **November 17th**, we will gather for a special Harvest of Hope Sunday. Not only will we burn the mortgage and celebrate being debt-free, but we will also share in a joyous celebration together. This is a momentous occasion—a time to reflect on how far we've come and to dream about where God is leading us next. This day will be a powerful reminder that when we dare to dream and follow God's call, anything is possible.

So, as we celebrate the saints who have gone before us and dare to dream about the future, let's step forward with courage. Let's be bold in our prayers, hopeful in our dreams, and active in our faith.

I can't wait to see what God will do next in the life of our church. Please mark your calendars for **November 17th** for Harvest of Hope Sunday. Let's celebrate together and step into the next chapter with joy, gratitude, and bold dreams for the future.

IT'S JUBILEE CHRISTMAS TIME!

On Saturday, December 7th we celebrate Jubilee Christmas 2024. SUMC will be hosting 16 families from Homecroft Elementary who have been selected by the school staff and would not have a Christmas without assistance. We have both Hispanic and English speaking families and each family has a host from or church.

Over the next few weeks we are gathering details about personal needs, clothing information and gift and toy wishes. Every child/youth in the family, from birth to 18 years old is included. On Jubilee Day, Hosts, adult members of the Families and extra Helping Hands gather at church for a time of fellowship, gift wrapping and surprises.

The Jubilee Christmas ministry happens because of your involvement and support. We have a short timeframe this year to shop (online and in stores), gather items needed for Jubilee Day (wrapping supplies, gift cards) and arrange for home baked cookies to enjoy Jubilee Day and to send home for the families to share.

Members of the Jubilee Team are available to answer questions and assist with your desire to participate. We hope the following information is helpful as you prayerfully consider the opportunities to serve our Jubilee Families.

- We will open the Jubilee season on Thursdays and Sundays starting November 7th and 10th in the Gathering Pace. Shopping begins November 7th.
- You will find tags on the next steps board for personal items, coats, gift cards, household needs. Browse and select what you would like to donate. REMEMBER TO CHECK BACK THROUGHOUT NOVEMBER. ADDITIONAL FAMILIES WITH NEEDS WILL BE ADDED.
- The link to Amazon online shopping will be available November 7th. Team members will assist if you would like to make an Amazon purchase while you are at church. Items from Amazon are shipped to a Jubilee Team member's home. Please do not change this shipping method.
- We provide blankets for the cold winter months. Some will be purchased and others will be kit-made with instructions available.
- If you would like to provide home baked cookies or help with wrapping on Jubilee Day, place your name on the appropriate form.
- All online gifts need to be delivered to our team member's home by December 1st. Tag items to be returned to church by the 1st.
