Dear Southport UMC,

There's something magical about finding an envelope in your mailbox with handwriting you recognize, especially this time of year. Whether it's a glossy family Christmas card

featuring matching sweaters, a letter from your aunt recounting every detail of her summer garden, or a card covered in glitter that ends up everywhere—it's always a joy to receive. The tradition of sending Christmas letters dates back to the early 19th century, when Sir Henry Cole in England popularized the first Christmas cards. Over time, it evolved into a cherished way to reconnect with loved ones and share the story of the year gone by.

As your new senior pastor, I must confess: I've never been so excited to share a season like this one! This is my first Advent and Christmas with you all, and I can't wait to celebrate together. Like a well-written Christmas letter, Advent invites us to slow down, remember the story of our beginnings, and rediscover the hope, love, joy, and peace found in Christ.

The word Advent means "arrival" or "coming." It's a season of anticipation and preparation, leading us to celebrate Christ's first coming in Bethlehem while also looking forward to his promised return. It's a time for us as a church to pause and reconnect with the heart of the gospel—the good news of God's great love, revealed to us in Jesus, fully human and fully divine.

This year, our Advent series, The Christmas Letters: Celebrating Advent with Those Who Told the Story First, will focus on some of the earliest "letters" ever written about the miracle of Christ's birth. Romans, 1 John, Philippians, and Colossians aren't just ancient writings; they're the church's first attempts to articulate the wonder of the Incarnation—how God became one of us. These texts serve as invitations to remember, reflect, and rejoice.

Just as we cherish the letters and cards we receive from loved ones today, the Epistles invite us to celebrate the mystery of the Word made flesh. As we read these holy words together, we'll discover anew how Christ's coming offers us hope for salvation, love incarnate, joy in humility, and peace through Christ's divinity.

So, as you're busy this December writing your cards or maybe even penning a Christmas letter of your own, take time to sit with these ancient letters, too. Let them inspire you to share the story of Christ with someone in your life who needs to hear it this year.

And of course, the season wouldn't be complete without our Christmas Eve worship. Join us as we gather in the glow of candlelight to celebrate the ultimate Christmas letter—the Word of God, made flesh, dwelling among us.

Together, we'll hear once more the timeless story from Luke 2 and reflect on God's incredible gift of downward mobility, coming to us in the humblest of ways.

From my family to yours, may this Advent season fill your hearts with warmth, your homes with joy, and your lives with the good news of Christ's love. I can't wait to see you in worship each week as we journey through this meaningful season together.






