
FEBRUARY 2025—Newsletter for Southport United Methodist Church

On behalf of all of us at Family Promise, thank you so much for your generosity last year! I note for tax purposes that you received no goods or services in exchange for your donation(s), which we note the total of below.

It was a pivotal year for the staff here at FPGI with promising transitions and additions to the team. With a full roster, our programs have expanded with the Apartment Shelter Program at a capacity of 28 units (3 of which are part of winter contingency), and Diversion and Aftercare serving a record number of families as well. We look forward to a bright and impactful 2025!

Here are just a few examples of what you made possible last year:

- Case management for 177 Diversion and 209 Aftercare members
- Shelter for 185 Apartment Shelter Program members (105 children)
- Investing \$283,598.71 on families in our programs for things such as first month's rent, job certifications, childcare, and transportation from the Family Assistance Fund – an initiative that you have continued since 2016!

The need continues to grow, but your continued support has been monumental in navigating the journey of homelessness and helped pave the way for a path to permanent housing for our families! We know that we couldn't do the work we do without each and every one of you. Thank you for your support in 2024!

FOOD PANTRY

For the month of **February we will be collecting Diapers for all the young women for their little ones. The diapers should be sizes 1,2,3,4,5,6 in the smaller packages.** The smaller packages help the moms get through until they can get their own or get help from many suppliers offering free diapers.

Thanks so much for all the help last year donating food, diapers, and money for the Meijer Simply Care Campaign ink December. There will be another Campaign again in the Spring.

Meijer is the store that fills the orders for food each month when needed. They also offer it at a discounted price which helps the pantry when supply is low.

We will be collecting the diapers from February 1st until February 10th.

FEED A NEED MINISTRY

The Feed a Need Team (FAN) will be bagging the 50 meals for the *Tear Down the Walls ministry*. We have been bagging meals for the last 4 years and are starting our 5th year. Recently many suitcases were donated to the ministry that the unhoused use to store and travel with their belongings. Also, 50 hand warmers were donated as well. These were very helpful for the last cold blast of days. Anyone is welcome to come help or just visit to see how we do things.

Bagging is on February 6th at 1 p.m. in the Gathering Area. We are also collecting Upper Room or other small devotional pamphlets. These fit nicely in the bags for the recipients to have to show the love of God.

CREATION CARE MINISTRY

If you were able to make it to the "Heart of the Matter: All Church Gathering" we had on January 26th you probably heard, we ended 2024 with a deficit of just under \$70,000 (By the way, if you didn't make it to that meeting, we did record it and there is a brand new "Leadership Team" page on our website at which you can find that video).

I know \$70,000 sounds like a lot of money, and it is, but our total budget for 2024, that is the amount of money we expected to both spend and bring in was \$1,050,000. Well, we sure did spend that much. We spent right at 1% over what we budgeted for. However, we did not bring in that much. The total for our income was 5% less than expected.

I hope we can see that being 6% off budget is an obstacle we can overcome. And it's not that surprising, all things considered. Please remember we paid off a huge debt in 2024, and although you are all faithful givers, this puts a strain on budgetary giving. We also had pastoral change, denomination issues, general economic turmoil, etc., to deal with. We also had several unplanned expenses that were good expenses but didn't help our budget.

\$21,246Overall, I can honestly say that I feel we are in a decentfinancial position. We do need to see a boost to budget giving in2025, and if we do instead of reporting we are in a decent financialposition I will be able to report we are in an excellent financial position. So, please prayerfully consider what you can do to help. Asalways, thank you for giving faithfully and without compulsion and(\$69,245)trusting us to use your gifts to do the work of Christ.
