

Money and the church. It's an awkward relationship. Have you noticed that?

Church finances involve navigating a unique mix of spiritual and practical considerations. Beyond the practicalities of budgeting and financial management, we also grapple with the intersection of faith, generosity, and the church's mission. This includes balancing the needs of ministry, the well-being of the congregation, the maintenance of the building, and the expenses of reaching out into the community. It's a lot to juggle.

Thankfully, I can report that our year to date giving as of the end of April is at a better place than it has been in the past three years and it is up 3.5% from where it was at this time last year. That is great news.

The unfortunate thing is even though our giving is up 3.5% from last year, our expenses are up 5%. Despite some in-depth planning and budgeting stuff has just happened. The list of unexpected expenses already this year includes 3 broken computers, broken sound equipment, a busted sump pump, a blown-up furnace, and a partridge in a pear tree. And I'm sure I missed a few. This all adds up to over \$10,000 in unexpected expenses.

This also all adds up to putting me in the awkward position of saying thank you, you are giving well, you are giving more, you are giving faithfully. But please prayerfully consider what else you might be able to do to help support SUMC financially.
