On Saturday, December 6th we celebrate Jubilee Christmas 2025. SUMC will be hosting 18 families from Homecroft Elementary who have been selected by the school staff and would not have a Christmas without assistance. We have both Hispanic and English speaking families and each family has a host from or church.

Over the next few weeks we are gathering details about personal needs, clothing information and gift and toy wishes. Every child/youth in the family, from birth to 18 years old is included. On Jubilee Day, Hosts, adult members of the Families and extra Helping Hands gather at church for a time of fellowship, gift wrapping and surprises.

The Jubilee Christmas ministry happens because of your involvement and support. We have a short timeframe this year to shop (online and in stores), gather items needed for Jubilee Day (wrapping supplies, gift cards) and arrange for home baked cookies to enjoy Jubilee Day and to send home for the families to share.

The link to Amazon online shopping will be available November 6th. Team members will assist if you would like to make an Amazon purchase while you are at church. Items from Amazon are shipped to a Jubilee Team member's home. Please do not change this shipping method.

If you would like to provide home baked cookies or help with wrapping on Jubilee Day, place your name on the appropriate form.

All online gifts need to be delivered to our team member's home by November 30th. Tag items to be returned to church also by November 30th.

My kids were moaning and groaning the other day about having to do chores. So, my wife sat them down and talked to them about how it is a lot easier for everyone if we all pitch in and do our part.

Reviewing our budget reminded me of that conversation. I noticed that 22% of our budget goes to facilities; that's stuff like utilities and insurance, but a big portion of it is maintenance. For a bit of perspective, a good average for how much of a church's budget goes to facilities is 30%. Our number is so much better than average in large because of all the time and talent that you give. It ranges from skilled work, like electrical and concrete work, to "elbow grease" work like pulling weeds and cleaning chairs, but it all adds up to make a big difference. It means that we can pour more resources into ministry, and that is a very good thing.

So, thank you for being so willing to lend a hand. Now, how do I get my kids to get this?
