### Pastor's Letter

#### Dear SUMC Family,

On behalf of Southport UMC, I want to extend my deepest gratitude for the generosity and faith you have shown through your financial gifts over the years. Your commitment to Christ and SUMC is appreciated and apparent. It is time to let you know about the next big step we are taking in stewardship. We will be replacing a large portion of our roof and encouraging cyclical giving to the church maintenance/improvement fund.

These steps are about more than repairing a structure; it is about creating a safe, welcoming, and lasting space where we can continue to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. This is no small task; the roof alone is estimated to cost around \$300,000.

Looking ahead, once the roof is complete, we hope to establish annual commitments of \$50,000 to our maintenance fund. This fund is above and beyond our regular maintenance budget line and will allow us to be proactive with maintenance projects and prevent the need for future large campaigns like this one. With your help we will be able to remain debt-free while responsibly caring for the church facilities that support our worship, ministries, and outreach.

Thank you, for believing in this vision and for helping us take such a significant step forward in stewardship. We ask for your continued prayers, engagement, and support as we move toward completing this task and building a stronger future for Southport UMC. Because of you, we are not only raising a roof but also strengthening our mission, ministry, and witness in the community and beyond.

# PAREROOF


#### PART 1

We have the opportunity to provide for a major need of our faith community, a new roof. Getting this major improvement to our facilities taken care of will free us up to more fully use our building to share the love of Christ.

**What**: Replace the church's flat roof, which is past due and failing in several areas

Why: To protect our building, ministry space, and long-term mission

Cost Estimate: \$300,000 for roof replacement (including labor and materials)





#### **BREAKING IT DOWN**

Because we all have unique giving capabilities, we cannot simply divide the total needed by the number of families in our church to determine an "average" gift. Following is a model of the distribution of gifts that it will take for us to be successful. This also underscores the biblical principle of giving in proportion to what we have – and that's going to be different for all of us!



#### **IT ALL COUNTS**

To ensure we always have the funds necessary to be good stewards of our space and provide effective ministry we need pledges for our maintenance fund. No matter how much you can pledge it will help.

Think you can't make a difference? The average drink from Starbucks costs \$6.25. If once a month instead of getting your coffee fix help us fix that leaky faucet. \$6.25 a month is \$75 a year and we can replace two faucets with that!

# Q & A

#### Q: How did this get started?

A: We asked, "what's next?" With the completion and success of the What If debt elimination campaign, we had to ask what's next. Being debt free has freed us up to expand our ministries and even add several new ones. We are thankful for this and want to be able to maintain this momentum into the future. The burden of that debt, however, did come with us deferring several maintenance items, including the roof. So, what's next in terms of stewardship at SUMC is getting caught up with those items, so we can continue to offer hope and grace for generations to come.

## Q: Have we investigated the possibility that insurance will help with roof replacement?

**A:** We have. In fact the shingled parts of our roof were replaced after a hail storm in 2015. The other sections of the roof are more durable and did not sustain damages at that time. So, the roof is in need of replacement because of normal wear and tear which is not covered by insurance.

#### A: Q: Isn't there a grant for this?

for

We have folks regularly seeking and applying grants for SUMC. The reality is that our

status as a religious organization limits us from some grants. The nature of this need is also limiting as most grants do not cover what is considered normal maintenance or operating expenses.

That being said, we are in the process of seeking grants for several security improvements. Keep an eye out for those.

#### Q: The roof looks fine to me, why are we replacing it?

A: The shingled parts of the roof you can see from

the ground are in good shape. But, the flat part -about half of the roof- which you can't see is not in good shape. It is about 10 years past its expected life, has had several small leaks, and has been patched and repaired many times. Keep in mind the \$300,000 is an estimate. Anything raised above the cost of the roof will be used for other maintenance needs of our facility.

#### Q: What other maintenance items need to be done?

**A:** There is an extensive list of items that need to be repaired, replaced, or upgraded in the near future. The leadership team in coordination with the staff and key members keep this list updated and prioritized in keeping with our mission & vision.

#### Q: How is progress going to be communicated?

**A:** We will communicate the progress of Raise the Roof: Covering the Future regularly. We will use all the standard forms of communication: announcements, monthly newsletters, weekly emails and maybe even share our progress in a few unique ways too.

#### Q: How can I help?

**A:** Anything you can do will help. Of course pledging and fulfilling your pledges is critical. But, you can help in many other ways too. Make sure to participate in the random opportunities like Operation Bring the Heat, Popsicle Stick Church, and Preachin' from the Roof. And of course, don't forget the power of prayer. We encourage you to pray often for the church Raise the Roof is no exception.

# **Staying True to Purpose**

As we go through the process of replacing our roof and fortifying our church improvement fund it is important that we remain true to who we are and whose we are. We are a faith community that is intentional about sharing God's love in all that we do. That means continuing to connect with our community, growing in our relationships and faith, serving often and extravagantly, giving generously, and going beyond our walls with Christ's message of hope and grace.

We can't hit the pause button. We have to keep going into the world, keep doing God's work, and keep being Christ's servants. This is what our faith calls us to do and it is how good stewardship works.

We will kicked this thing off with Operation Bring the Heat where we raised money for the roof, and financially support three nonprofits that our community is passionate about and that do extraordinary work.

In this same vein we will end the campaign by finding a roof (we aren't sure which one yet) that needs to be replaced. It may be a nonprofit organization it may be a community member, but we are called to pass on a portion of what God blesses us with. So, that is what we will do. That's why when we talk about the expense for the roof we say \$300,000, but when we talk about how much we need to raise we say \$330,000. Thank you, for all your gifts!

Everyone is sharing God's grace and hope through Jesus Christ in their 24x7 lives. So that...we are making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of our community and the world.
