Rediscovering the Wonder

There's something about December that makes the soul lean in a little closer. Maybe it's the glow of lights in the early evening or the way familiar carols rise up from memories we didn't even know we were holding. Maybe it's the quiet moments—rare as they are—where the world slows down just enough for us to catch our breath. Whatever the reason, this month has a way of making wonder possible again.

Wonder is different from excitement or nostalgia. It's deeper, quieter, and often surprising. Wonder is what happens when we recognize that God is doing something far bigger than we expected—sometimes in places we never thought to look. Advent invites us back into that kind of wonder.

It doesn't ask us to rush toward Christmas or to prepare the "perfect" holiday. Advent simply asks us to pay attention. To notice the hope rising in unlikely places. To look for signs of peace in a restless world. To remember that joy often blooms in the cracks. To receive love in its most unexpected forms.

If we let it, wonder has a way of softening us. It slows our pace. It widens our hearts. It helps us see our everyday lives through a sacred lens—ordinary moments that suddenly shimmer with God's presence.

So this December, I invite you to reclaim the gift of wonder. Let yourself pause a little longer when you see the first Advent candle lit. Listen a little more closely to the voices around you. Look for God in the faces you pass, the conversations you share, and the places where you're tempted to believe nothing holy could possibly grow.

Because the story at the heart of this season—the story of God coming close—is filled with wonder from beginning to end. It's the kind of wonder that breaks through darkness, speaks peace into fear, and chooses love over distance every single time.

My prayer is that this month you'll experience moments that cause you to stop, breathe deeply, and whisper a quiet, "Thank you, God... you're here." May we all rediscover the wonder of it all.



Main Entry Canopy/Awning

Back in 2023, an IndyGo bus hit our main entry awning and damaged the fabric. The awning was able to be repaired and was recovered with new fabric. Earlier this year, we had another incident where a U-haul truck hit our main entry awning. In this incident, the damage was structurally significant and it required us to remove the awning to allow for safe entry and exit through the main and the education entry doors.

We have been working with our insurance carrier to cover the costs associated with this incident. The Leadership Team (LT) is also taking a broader look at the situation to provide a replacement solution that is less likely to be damaged by vehicles going forward. This likely means a taller "canopy" that is more permanent and architecturally appealing as compared to a replacement awning.

We have applied for and been granted some funding to complete an architectural design package for a new canopy. That design process is in progress now. Once a design is complete, we will solicit quotes for the construction. This will obviously cost more than the insurance proceeds from the awning, so we will need to find additional funding to complete it. Similarly, we would also need to find additional funding to construct a replacement awning due to the insurance deductible.

This is a time consuming process. Generally the steps are as follows. 1 - Apply for the grant; 2 - Receive grant approval; 3 - Complete architectural design; 4 - Obtain competitive quotes for construction; 5 - Choose a construction vendor; 6 - Obtain construction permits; 7 - Schedule and complete the construction. We have just started step 3 of this process.

So please be patient with us as we work through the process. This means that we will likely not have an awning/canopy this winter, but we hope to be in a position to build a more permanent canopy in the spring. So while this does cause some inconvenience now, it would provide a much improved solution for the long term.

Drivers Needed!




The Roof Replacement is underway! Thank you for such a great start.

OK, story time! There was a man who wanted to take up farming to make a living.
