A NEW YEAR FULL OF WONDER, LIGHT, AND POSSIBILITY

January always feels a bit like opening a brand-new notebook—crisp pages, no coffee stains yet, and endless possibilities ahead. There's something sacred about that "fresh start" feeling. The church year understands this impulse, too. We turn the page from Advent's holy anticipation and Christmas's joyful celebration, and we step into a season that continues to whisper, "Look—God is still doing something new."

As a church family, we spent December rediscovering the **Wonder** of God breaking into the world. From candlelit carols to the simple beauty of the Nativity, the season reminded us that God still surprises us, still delights us, and still invites us to marvel at grace made visible. And now—right on cue—the next chapter of the Christian calendar nudges us forward with fresh clarity.

First comes **Epiphany**, a fancy word that basically means "Aha! God is revealing something!" It's the moment when the Magi follow the star to Jesus, showing us that God's love was never meant for just a few, but for the whole world. Epiphany invites us to ask: Where is God's light guiding us today? What new things might God be revealing in our life together?

Right after that, we celebrate **Baptism of the Lord Sunday**, when Jesus steps into the Jordan River and hears those powerful words: "You are my beloved." In remembering his baptism, we remember our own callings. God still speaks. God still claims us. God still sends us. It's a moment that reminds us that we are here not by accident but by calling—a community shaped and sent by the voice of God.

All of this sets the perfect stage for our first sermon series of the new year: Forgiveness.

If you've ever carried a grudge longer than you intended (or found yourself replaying a conversation while brushing your teeth), then you'll understand why this series matters—not just for the church, but especially for a new year. We'll explore what forgiveness really looks like, why it feels so hard, and how Scripture invites us to experience the freedom God wants for us. Forgiveness isn't about pretending the past didn't hurt. It's about loosening the grip those hurts have on our present.

This new year offers us a fresh canvas—not because everything magically resets at midnight, but because God continually calls us into a life of healing, reconciliation, and renewed purpose. My hope is that this January, as we bask in the lingering Wonder of Christmas and follow the light of Epiphany, we'll step more fully into the freedom God longs for each of us to know. Here's to a year of revelation, calling, and deep grace.
